Dear Subscribers and all concert goers! Thank YOU so much for having stayed the course with us over the past two years as we've continued to serve up the variety of innovative & creative programs that characterize our many years of work.

This season we're going back to the repertory that was our early speciality: music from the Spanish court and from the streets of Madrid, and more recently from the New World. You'll hear the orchestra more—starting with the music of Marianna Martines and Tonadillas & Cantatas from the public theaters and the Court.

From the New World we bring back RumBarroco, the Venezuelan-led ensemble of Early Music specialists who are experts in fusion, adding a Latino edge to 'America's' musics.

Meanwhile we're taking our music on the road, Spanish Music from the Dance is going to Palestine, Texas, hosted by For the Love of Music, their local music series, and the same program to the Kimbell Museum as an adjunct to their recently opened Murillo exhibit. Join us on January 14 for their exhibit *Murillo: From Heaven to Earth*, 50 paintings drawn from the Musée du Louvre, the National Gallery of Art, the Hispanic Society, and more.

We're also returning to Lewisville, South Dallas, Pleasant Grove and St. Luke's for Community concerts of our regular concert rep, the Christmas/Epiphany concerts and Celebrating Juneteenth.

We're about to come back from Covid with our Education programs that took such a hit over the past two years. Our return to DISD with post-Covid education brought back the Summer Strings Camp after its having been cancelled twice. Unfortunately our Camp numbers were way down, but the quality of the students was a breath of fresh air, our younger students out-performing what we heard before Covid, a promise of great things to come.

With the current academic year we welcome new Visual and Performing Arts Staff to this important office for Dallas students. I must applaud those we have worked with in the past and the new group who are faced with the monumental task of keeping the Arts so central to Dallas education, DISD in general and the local Arts groups serving our large and colorful population very well.

ONS has had a central role with our Strings Camps, with our much treasured string instrument lessons both live and virtual, Flamenco Lessons on video, and at its best the operatic and dance shows we've produced as world and US premières of neglected Spanish and Latin American stage works and their rich history.

Our concert season is actually part of the larger project we pursue, noted for its variety and excellence.
